The Left	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aims • Rebellion January 1919 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • non-democratic, soviet Germany like in Russia • Spartacists set up soviets in many towns • defeated by government army & Freikorps
The Right	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aims • Kapp-Putsch 1923/1920 • Munich-Putsch 1923 • Reactions to Versailles • Reactions to the Weimar Constitution 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • dictatorship • strong army • strong industry • empire <p>→ new Imperial Germany</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 5000 Freikorps led by Kapp invade Berlin • army refuses to fire • people go on strike → no transport, power, water • Kapp gives up <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hitler wants to take over Bavaria • Nazis vs. Police → Nazis lose • Hitler's miscalculation: not enough public support <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Treaty of Versailles is complete opposite of their aims → angry, appalled, felt stabbed in the back • democracy, but Nazis wanted a dictatorship → complete opposite

Results Sheet: Economic Disaster

<p>The Ruhr</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • occupation • poster messages • reparations 	<p>1923: France occupies Ruhr area → take natural resources to pay own debts to USA</p> <p>Germany strikes → France kills workers/expells protesters → collapse of German currency</p> <p>S9: Germans shall boycott French/Belgian goods due to French occupation in the Ruhr area</p> <p>S10: Britain & France think Germany is overreaching → Germany tries to trick them</p> <p>Germany has to pay £6600 million in annual instalments</p> <p>1921: Germany pays £50 million</p> <p>1922: Germany pays nothing → played on time & negotiations</p>
<p>Hyperinflation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • meaning • the value of money • impact on Germans 	<p>country has no goods to trade → government prints money → country pays off its debts BUT</p> <p>→ money becomes worthless e.g.: Nov. 1923: 1 billion mark buy 1 loaf of bread</p> <p>→ daily payment of wages → poor people suffered → greatest casualties = richer Germans with savings → Germans used money to start fire</p>
